*1% penalty will be charged on July 4<sup>th</sup> to all current taxes (2011) that are outstanding.*

***\*\*Picnic tables located at campgrounds can be borrowed. Please contact the Town Office before removing the tables just in case campers or other organizations have reserved them\*\****

### **Vehicle and Trailer Parking – The Traffic Bylaw No. 2/10**

#### **Vehicles – 72 Hour Limit**

#### **All Trailers – 96 Hour Limit**

**No person shall park any vehicle continuously longer than the time specified.**

- A motor vehicle may be parked in any lane for the purpose of loading or unloading, provided that such motor vehicle shall be parked for a period exceeding fifteen (15) minutes, unless written permission has first been obtained from the Bylaw Enforcement Officer for an extension of such time.
- No operator of a vehicle shall stop such vehicle in any of the following places, except when necessary to avoid collision or conflict with each other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a Peace Officer or traffic sign or signal:
  - (a) On the driving lane of any street
  - (b) Within an intersection
  - (c) On a sidewalk
  - (d) On a crosswalk
  - (e) On a boulevard
  - (f) Within four and one-half (4.5m) meters of the driveway entrance to any fire station.

**Take consideration for other homeowners, intersections, alleyways, etc.**

### **Numbers on all Buildings**

To help with 911 we would like to ask your assistance by putting visible number(s) on all buildings, commercial and residential in front for east identification of civic (Street) locations.

### **Litter – Dogs and Cats Bylaw No. 3/08**

If a dog or cat defecates on any public property other than the property of the owner, possessor or harbourer of the said dog or cat, the owner, possessor or harbourer of the dog or cat shall cause such defecation to be removed immediately and disposed of in a sanitary fashion. Failure to cause such removal shall be an infraction of this Bylaw. Penalty (fine) for first offence \$50.00.

### **Trees and Shrubs – On your property, including portions hanging off your property are your responsibilities to maintain and trim.**

Just a reminder to keep your trees and shrubs on the corner lots trimmed so that the traffic at the intersections/ laneways can be seen in every direction no more than three (3) feet high. Also remember to keep your trees along sidewalks trimmed, so pedestrians are able to use the sidewalks properly. Laneways are to be trimmed back as well for vehicles to get through.

**“Elm Trees”** – means any tree or part of a tree, living or dead, of the Ulmus genus and its cultivars, including the American Siberian and Japanese elm trees, and includes any elm tree in the form of fuel wood, nursery stock, lumber, woodchips, log, branches or bark.

### **Observe the annual pruning ban. Do not prune your Elms between April 1<sup>st</sup> and August 31<sup>st</sup>.**

The Elm Bark Beetle that spreads the DED fungus is attached to freshly cut elm and is most active during this period.

Don't use, store, or transport Elm wood. It's illegal! One piece of elm firewood can carry over 1800 infested elm bark beetles. The DED regulations apply to all Elms including Siberian & Manchurian Elms.

### **Pest Prevention Tips**

Here are some tips to follow to deter pest from inhabiting any property:

- Do not allow garbage, lawn waste or other debris to accumulate on your property
- Keep all materials such as building materials and fire wood neatly stacked and off the ground a minimum of 0.15 meters (6 inches)
- All sheds should be placed on a cement/ asphalt pad or a six (6) inch base of crushed rock to prevent pests from burrowing underneath
- Secure garbage in containers with lids and eliminate any standing water
- Inspect property, building, vehicles and trailers on a regular basis for signs of pests
- When using poisons to control pests please use extreme caution to avoid any unwanted poisonings

### **Mosquitoes**

In order to keep the mosquitoes population down we need to ensure that they are not creating breeding ground around your house or business.

Here are some tips:

- Look for places where rainwater collects and stands
- Check and empty items such as birdbaths, flower pots, wading pools, fountains, fish ponds, cans, bottles, tires, rain barrels, tree holes and any other items in your yard that may hold water
- Fill holes where you find standing water
- Swimming pools need to be maintain
- Remove water that collects on pool covers
- Turn over wading pools when not in use
- Eaves troughs and drains. Don't let things pile up! Clear leaves and twigs from eave troughs, storm and roof gutters throughout the summer. Make sure drainage ditches are not clogged.
- Check flat roofs for standing water
- Cut lawns frequently. Clear away lawn cuttings, leaves and other debris
- Clear out dense shrubbery where mosquitoes like to breed and rest

### Bylaw #6/10

- Hours for outside watering are 7:00 to 10:00 morning and evening.
- Odd numbered addresses shall be allowed to use water for outdoor purposes on odd numbered calendars days.
- Even numbered addresses shall be allowed to use water for outdoor purposes on even numbered calendar days.
- Water restrictions are in effect January to December of each year.
- **Penalties:**
  - First infraction of this Bylaw is \$100.00 (one hundred dollars)
  - Second & subsequent infractions is \$250.00 (two hundred & fifty dollars)

### Burning In Town

As per Bylaw No. 5/07, proper collection and disposal of garbage, no person shall burn any garbage or refuse within the town limits.

As per the Fire Pit Bylaw No. 3/09, only charcoal, cut seasoned wood, or manufacturer's logs are to be burned in fire pits. You are not to burn leaves, grass clippings, garden refuse, or any material that when burned will generate excessive smoke or an offensive odor. If smoke from a fire causes an unreasonable interference with the use and enjoyment of another person's property, the fire must be extinguished immediately.

Due to insurance reasons and safety issues with the conditions of the building the curling rink is tentatively scheduled to be demolished at the end of July this year.

### Nuisance and abatement Bylaw No.

#### Junked Vehicles

You must have a valid license plate on vehicle, and they can't be rusted, wrecked, partly wrecked or dismantled on your property. If you have a junked vehicle it has to be enclosed within an approved structures, or you have a business dealing with junked vehicles.

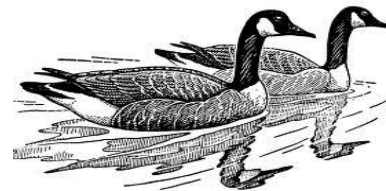

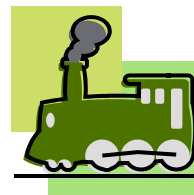

If anyone has westerns or large print books they want get rid of please donate them to the library. Please do not put donated books in the outside box as this is for returned library books.

There is an ongoing book sale of donated books. Paperbacks are \$.25 each or 5/\$1.00, hardcovers are \$1.00 each and all others are at the librarian's discretion. We have a big variety of mystery paperbacks and hardcovers, romance, non-fiction, crafts, kid's books etc. Come and check out the selection. Any donations could be put to purchasing large print books for our library as we could use some new ones.

There is also a Teen Reading Challenge for grades 8 & up. For every book read there is a ballot to fill out and enter to win prizes at the end of summer. The idea is to use library books, so bring the children for books and read, read, read this summer. The more books read the more chances to win prizes. We have new junior books and graphic novels, also a good selection of young adult books. We are always getting new books in.
